My name is Pamela Lopes; I would like to take this time to introduce myself. I have worked with children for over 30 years and in that time, I had a very successful home day care for over 16 years. Then, in 2010, I was hired on with the Peel School Board as a D.E.C.E. It hasn't always been easy. When I was hired, I had to figure out my role, as did many of us. One thing we do need to remember is that changes don't happen over night, it takes time.

Like many other members, I saw the need for change, so I became more involved with the ERFP. When the D.E.C.E Outline of Expectation memo went out in 2013, I jumped at the opportunity to be part of the group to get this started as I feel it's important that everyone has a good understanding of what our job involves and how to perform it effectively. Then, in 2016, I applied to become a Mentor. I wanted to share my learning and to meet with other D.E.C.E'S.
